What is Epiphany?

Epiphany is the celebration of the arrival of the Wise Men to Bethlehem, revealing the good news of the Christian message and the reign of Christ being for the whole world. Although, we are celebrating Epiphany on January 5, the season of Epiphany begins on Monday, January 6 and continues until Ash Wednesday.

What Are the 12 Days of Christmas?

For many Western Christian denominations, the Twelve Days of Christmas, or Christmastide, are a 12-day festive religious season that celebrates the Nativity of Jesus. The 12 days represent the time that it took for the three wise men or kings to travel to Bethlehem to visit baby Jesus and offer him gifts. In certain Eastern Orthodox denominations, it is instead a celebration of the time from Christ's birth to his baptism.

This festival season is basically a series of religious feast days—as well as a constant stream of entertaining and merrymaking!

The festival season, which begins on Christmas Day (December 25), ends on the evening of January 5 (called Twelfth Night); this marks the end of Christmas festivities and, in ancient Celtic tradition, the end of the 12-day winter solstice celebration.

The Twelve Days of Christmas festival season is nearly forgotten in the United States for various reasons, but some traditions survived, as did some religious feast days for practicing Christians.

Thank you to all the members of Calvary UCC who generously donated non-perishable food items to the Crestline Community Christmas program to brighten the Christmas of the less fortunate in the village of Crestline. May the spirit of giving guide our hearts as we continue to do church work at Calvary UCC and beyond our church throughout the year of 2025.
